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Wetzlar as a City of Law

Until 1806, Wetzlar was one of the "imperial cities" of the Holy Roman Empire of the German Nation and the seat of the Empire's highest court: the Reichskammergericht or Imperial Chamber Court.

To create peace through law – this was the assigned task of the court, which was meant to ensure orderly, judicial proceedings and thus to steer conflicts into peaceful channels. Even after its dissolution, it continued to set judicial standards in Germany.

The Reichskammergericht Museum exhibits original items bearing witness to three centuries of German legal history. The structures and modes of operation of the Court are explained in an audio-visual presentation and an audio guide.
